I received the 4th quarter contribution report for the area. In 2011 39.49% groups contributed to G.S.O. compared to 44.75% in 2010. As you can see the percentage of groups that contributed last year was down slightly from the year before. I would like to encourage you to remind your groups to help support the work of G.S.O. If each group would give what they can the amounts can add up so that we are truly self supporting through our own contributions. I have copies of the report by district and would ask each DCM or their alternate to pick up the copy for your district today.

A letter was sent from the records manager at G.S.O. To all Area Registrars. The deadline for submission of hard copy updates of group information for the Regional Directories is Friday, May 4th. This is the date the form must be received by the office. Area Registrars can input updates to the FNV until Friday, May 11th. DCMs if you haven't worked with the registrar to update your districts information please do so NOW.

This past week I sent out via email the latest A.A.W.S. Highlights and asked DCMs to distribute it to their GSRs. I know that some of you have done that and I thank you. SPECIAL NEEDS CHAIR –Thomas D.

1. The Special Needs Committee met on February 11, 2012 at Johnson Creek to work on the 2 projects that are left of our priorities.
 - a) The outline of materials for the Special Needs District Chair kit was further developed and now the kit needs to be finalized and the plan for providing copies to chairs implemented. By making this kit available to guide the chairs on what materials are available, how to hold a meeting, and guidelines for priorities and responsibilities, we believe districts will more easily be able to set up Special Needs Committees and find chairpersons for them, thereby advancing the further accessibility of AA to the alcoholic still suffering.
 - b) Also discussed were the items we would like to see on the Area Website relating to Special Needs to make it easier for all persons in the Area to readily access relevant materials.
2. We are hopeful both of these projects will be fully completed by the end of the year.
3. We are looking for persons interested in the committee and would welcome suggestions.

GRAPEVINE CHAIR – Stu E.

Good morning all. I would like to share some news about the Grapevine and about the activity of our Area 75 Grapevine Committee since our last gathering in January. Very late in 2011, the Grapevine Office Manager contacted me to ask whether we could display some materials for Grapevine/LaVina at this year's WI Conference of Young People in A.A. (WICYPAA), late in January. I agreed. Grapevine sent display materials. Then, I was scheduled for some surgery and would be hospitalized at the time of that conference. The end result was that Kris C. went in my place. Kris is the Grapevine Chair and a Past DCM from District 31. She managed the display and distributed much of the complimentary material that Grapevine/LaVina had sent. So, our thanks to Kris for her dedicated service on behalf of the committee!

It was reported in the March edition of *AAWS Highlights* that, "With the move of the Grapevine from the 10th Floor in the building to smaller offices on the 12th Floor, G.S.O. has begun handling on-site shipping, mailroom and sales functions." It was reported late last year that the Grapevine staff has been downsized in an economizing move. The office move alone will save about \$50,000.00 per year in rent.

I am working on an information sheet about the Grapevine and *LaVina* aspects of the Area 75 Corrections Literature Fund. It should be ready to distribute in a few weeks at the Area 75 Spring Conference. And I hope, with the Grapevine Committee's concurrence, to post it on the Area 75 website. In general, we have Grapevine and *LaVina* subscriptions available from the Area 75 Corrections Literature Fund in cases where local resources do not meet the demand of the jail and prison groups for the magazines. It is hoped that local resources will be searched out first by corrections chairs and outside sponsors. In addition, we are trying to move away from using Gift Subscriptions for renewing the current subscriptions. This was done in the past in some cases, and it has proven problematical. We need to be able to verify that the subscription recipient is still actively involved as an outside sponsor or corrections chair conducting meetings "inside". With no phone numbers or email addresses the paperwork we get at renewal time, that is difficult. So, in the future, renewal notices will be sent to the subscription recipient.
